

Family Survey Summary

St Mark CES

April 2017

Main themes from the Family Survey:

- 137 responses total
- Most respondents (61%) live within 500m-1.6km of the school
- 58% of respondents drive their children to school each day, 25% by walking, 15% bused
- 42% of respondents (parents/guardians) walked to school when they were elementary school aged, 35% bused
- The majority (70%) of respondents agree/strongly agree that school travel contributes to physical well-being and environmental well being
- For respondents who drive, Weather (45%), Convenience/time pressure (53%) and on their way elsewhere (40%) were the main factors
- Respondents indicated that they would let their child walk to school if they were older (58%) or did not walk alone (38%)
- 61% of respondents feel the neighbourhood is safe for children to walk to/from school and to support active travel promotion. 22% were unsure, 18% said no.
